









What is Polio?

Poliomyelitis is a highly infectious viral disease, which mainly affects children. The virus is transmitted through contaminated food and water, and multiplies in the intestine, from where it can invade the nervous system.

The polio virus attacks the central nervous system, sometimes causing paralysis, muscular atrophy, deformation and, in some cases, death.







The Rotary Foundation and clubs invest in our future leaders and philanthropists by funding scholarships for undergraduate and graduate study









Full Scholarships



 Scholarships last from one to four years and can include an entire degree program. Global grant scholarships are funded using cash or District Designated Funds matched by the World Fund.

Smaller Scholarships

 District grants can be used to sponsor secondary school, undergraduate or graduate students studying any subject, either locally or abroad. The scholarship may cover any length of time, from a six-week language training program to a year or more of university study.



District Grants



The journey of a District Grant

- > Raise funds to support a project local, national or international
- > Complete an MOU (Memorandum Of Understanding) which generates a project reference number
- > Complete a project proposal (everything is done online and is very straight forward) up to £1000 support from District
- Project proposal is approved (or queried)
- Complete the full grant application
- > Once the full application is approved you will be notified and the funds will be transferred to your account
- Start the project
- > Once project complete, make sure you get as much publicity as possible, preferably outward facing publicity
- > When the project is complete with all receipts and publicity, send in your report either interim or final

Global Grants are dealt with by Evanston, but the matching DDF comes from District 1070, so it's imperative that you contact your district team before commencing a Global Grant application - \$30,000 to \$400,000

Community Projects We are able to offer both financial and practical assistance with worthwhile projects within the community. Past projects include assistance with upgrading the facilities at the Godmanchester Nursery and installing a quiet garden at the Thongsley Fields School.



Rotary Worldwide

International projects are important to us. We raise funds for schools, help with medical projects and make support available in times of crisis. Rotary uses its international network to provide aid direct to those in the greatest need.

Most of the money we raise is distributed to deserving causes within the Huntingdon area.
